### Former Brunswick Creamery Eligible for BHS Historic Marker

Within walking distance of the Garfield School stands an old structure with a history that reminds us how life has changed over the last one hundred years. The gracious frame residence of longtime BHS members Bob and Becky Cipperly on Moonlawn Road was constructed about 1900 to serve as the headquarters of the Brunswick Creamery and Produce Co. The principal operator and probable founder of this enterprise was Louis B. Thurston. While a photograph of the structure in the Society's collection shows the Brunswick Creamery and Produce Co. featured a broadside painted across its front indicating it was a supplier of milk, cream, butter, and eggs, documentary evidence suggests Thurston's business was, at least at some point, a major producer of butter. Thurston's occupation, in the 1900 federal census, is listed as that of manufacturer of butter, and, in the 1905 state census, as manager of a butter factory. Thurston apparently spread his butter too thin, however, as the company was declared bankrupt about 1916. Butter jars and butter shipping boxes were listed as among the firm's remaining assets.

Alvah H. Carner subsequently purchased the property, establishing his residence and a milk dealership at the old creamery. His business was apparently substantial as Moonlawn Road

became known as Creamery Road (1925 New York State Census). One of Carner's daughters, Florence (1909-1999), married J. Roswell Lee, son of Joseph Lee who also operated a dairy. The Cipperlys have owned the old creamery for nearly 50 years, and learned about the various modifications made to the structure firsthand from Florence Carner Lee, who served as Brunswick Town Historian 1960-1985. The building retains its slate roofing and novelty clapboard siding. The Cipperlys enjoy telling how they found traces of the Brunswick Creamery and Produce Co.'s broadside while scraping old paint in preparation for repainting.

The bronze historic marker for the Cipperly residence is currently being produced, and we hope to present it before the holidays. This year our committee welcomes the participation of Dr. John Delano, and we anxiously await the completion of marker applications on behalf of several other homes with a history to share.

### BRUNSWICK VETERAN'S MEMORIAL PARK


